



## INFORMATION FOR TRAVELLERS ARRIVING FROM ABROAD TO METROPOLITAN FRANCE

You are arriving from a European country or a country or territory which, in view of its favourable health situation, characterised by a mild or moderate circulation of the virus, is classified as a **green zone** defined by the Decree of 7 June, 2021 identifying areas of SARS-CoV-2 virus circulation.

(\*\*) Positive RT-PCR test result more than 11 days old and less than 6 months old. This result is only valid for arrivals from an EU member state, Andorra, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, Norway, San Marino, the Holy See or Switzerland.
